



Drivers License Suspension

Drivers License Suspension is an enforcement technique used by the Child Support Enforcement Agency (CSEA) when an Obligor is in Default of his/her current Support Order.

For a case to qualify for drivers license suspension, the following criteria must be met:

- There must be an ongoing current Support Order.
- There must be three (3) months of no payment, or under certain circumstances less than full payment of the current monthly obligation.

- No active income withholding order.
- Advance Notice Of Default and Potential Action has been sent.

Once an Obligor's drivers license has been suspended or blocked, there is case specific criteria that must be met prior to reinstatement.

Driver's license reinstatement will not be completed until CSEA is able to verify that a payment has been made. Payment for driver's license reinstatement can be made in the following manner:

- Cash payment at the Fairfield County CSEA's Drive-thru Payment Center, 135 W. Chestnut St., Lancaster, OH 43130. Cashier will provide Obligor with a receipt to take to CSEA as proof of payment.
- Money order or cashier's check brought to CSEA's Drive-thru Payment Center
- Mailed payment to the Ohio Child Support Payment Central (OCSPC), P.O. Box 182372, Columbus, OH 43218-2372
- **All payments must include Obligor's name, Social Security Number, SETS case number, and order number**

Once the driver's license reinstatement criteria has been satisfied, the Obligor will be provided with a reinstatement form. The Obligor will need to go to an Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles (OBMV) reinstatement center. The OBMV will charge a fee for reinstatement.



****If a driver's license has to be re-suspended, FULL ARREARS PAYMENT and a valid income source may be required for reinstatement.****
